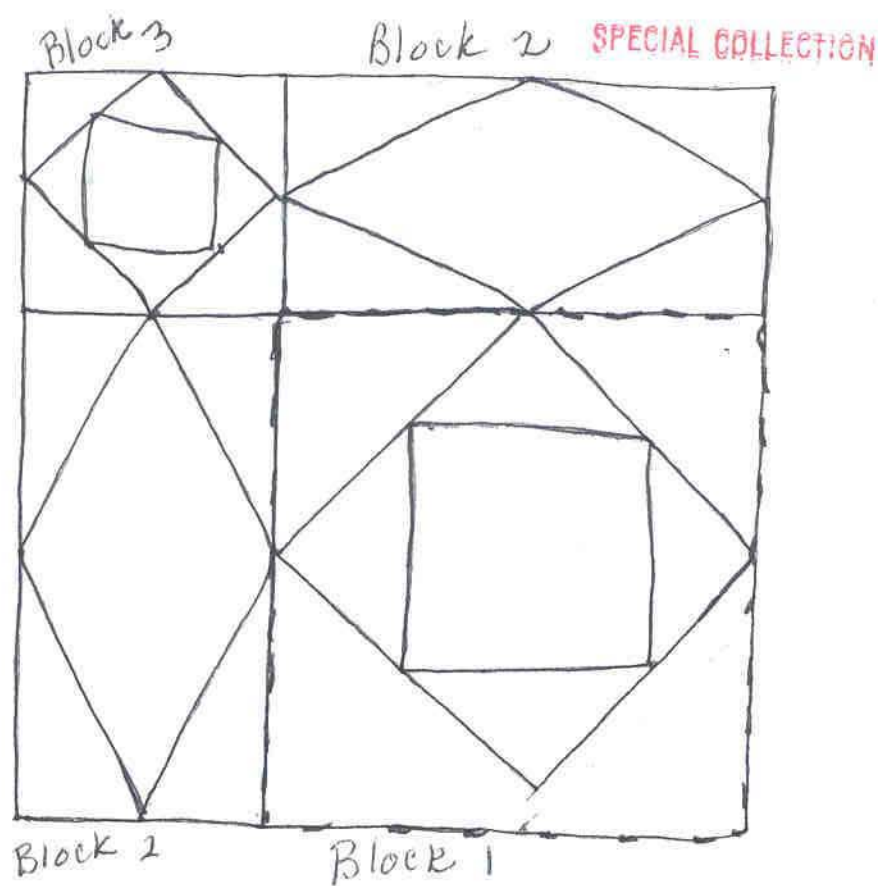

This design was on a pamphlet about the Appalachian Fireside Craft of Owsley County. It looked pretty. Bertha Noble blocked it out in blocks, named it and got some help to cut the pattern. Green would represent Spring or Summer in the Appalachian. Tans, yellow, orange or red could represent the Appalachian-Autumn

It is easier pieced in small blocks, then set back together, block 1, block 2, and block 3. All put back together to form this block. It is an all over design. Using the small square at the left top of each block, set the blocks back together.
